Emotional Intelligence Predicts Academic Performance

This meta-analysis shows that emotional intelligence has a small to moderate association with academic performance, such that students with higher emotional intelligence tend to gain higher grades and achievement test scores The association is stronger for skill-based emotional intelligence tasks than rating scales of emotional intelligence

emotional intelligence, positive behavior, and critically, academic performance Increases in academic performance due to SEL programming were typically between 11 and 17 percentile points Taken together, theorists argue that increased academic performance may be a direct function of emotional intelligence (Brackett & Rivers, 2014)

Emotional intelligence and emotional skills develop over time, change throughout life, and can be improved through training and remedial programs as well as therapeutic techniques "General intelligence" is composed of cognitive intelligence, which is measured by IQ, and emotional intelligence, which is measured by EQ
